CREDENTIALS

For mandatory registration, done on-line via the team GotSPORT account, teams must provide the following required credentials:

US Club Teams:

- 1. US Club Roster.
- 2. Valid US Club Players Passes.
- 3. Valid player passes and loan papers for guest players.
- 4. A completed "Team Info Sheet" which is found on the WCS Registration page.

US Youth Soccer Teams:

- 1. Original State Approved Roster.
- 2. Validated US Youth Soccer Player Passes.
- 3. Permission to Travel Region 1 teams, with the exception of Connecticut and New Jersey, do not require Permission to Travel. Connecticut and New Jersey teams must provide a Permission to Travel. All non-Region 1 teams must provide a Permission to Travel.
- 4. Valid player passes for guest players.
- 5. A completed "Team Info Sheet" which is found on the WCS Registration page.

Foreign Teams:

- 1. Provincially approved player picture identification cards.
- 2. Teams must have a completed form from it Provincial or National Association approving the team's participation in the tournament.
- 3. A completed "Team Info Sheet" which is found on the WCS Registration page.

E-Waivers:

- 1. Every player, coach, and attending manager must complete the online showcase E-Waiver in order to participate. The waiver is available on the showcase website.
- 2. Players found to be participating in the event without a completed waiver risk expulsion from the event and having their team games forfeited.
- 3. Spectators do NOT have to complete an E-Waiver, only participants.

PLAYER AGE & ELIGIBILITY

Boys & Girls:

- U-20 = born on January 1, 2004 and after. **Flight, if it exists, will be with U19 **
- U-19 = born on January 1, 2005 and after.
- U-18 = born on January 1, 2006 and after.
- U-17 = born on January 1, 2007 and after.
- U-16 = born on January 1, 2008 and after.
- U-15 = born on January 1, 2009 and after.
- U-14 = born on January 1, 2010 and after. ** U14's will play in a U15 Flight **

ROSTERS

- May register a maximum of 22 players for the event. A team may use up to 5 guest players but any team utilizing guest players is still limited to a total of 22 players.
- Teams may only dress 18 players for any one (1) particular game. Players who are not playing in a particular game may not sit on the team bench or be on the same side of the field as their team. Teams that use more than 18 players in any one (1) particular game will forfeit that game.
- US Club Soccer teams may only take guest players registered under US Club Soccer, and USYSA teams may only take guest players registered with properly stamped USYSA player pass cards. No roster may be comprised of players with different passes from different organizations, or no "mixed rosters".

TEAMS

- No player may play for more than one team in the tournament for the duration of the event. This is an EPYSA mandated rule as a condition of tournament sanctioning.
- Any player found to have played for more than 1 team in the same event will cause all games in which he or she participated in, for their nonprimary team, to be forfeited.
- The home team is determined by the tournament scheduler. The first team listed in the tournament program (and website) is the home team.
- The home team will be responsible for using an alternate color uniform if necessary and shall supply a suitable game ball if the tournament does not provide one. (as determined by the Referee).
- If the home team cannot supply an alternate jersey, then the visiting team will.

SPECTATORS

- Spectators are not permitted behind goals and must stay on the opposite side of the field from the team benches or in any other specifically specified area. Do not follow your player / participant from end to end of the field. Sit in one place and remain there for the duration of the match.
- All spectators shall use appropriate behavior and language and are subject to
 ejection from the premises for verbal abuse subject to the discretion of the match
 referee, the tournament referee assignor, or the tournament director.

LAWS OF THE GAME

All matches must be played in accordance with FIFA Laws of the Game, except as specifically modified as follows in the tournament rules:

- Substitutions: At any moment of the match official's discretion. Officials are encouraged to allow for the game to flow and are not required to stop play for a substitute.
- Games will consist of two halves of equal length. The Directors reserve the right to adjust game length for conditions beyond their control.
- All games will consist of two equal halves of 35 minutes. As the event schedule
 is being constructed, should there be enough field space and time available to
 lengthen games, then the U17 to U20 age groups might be stretched to two
 equal halves of 40 minutes. Unless otherwise notified prior to the event by the
 Tournament Director, games will be 70 minutes long, with two equal halves of 35
 minutes. Teams are guaranteed 3 games of two equal 35-minute halves.
- The game clock will not be stopped because of injury to any player, except if deemed necessary by the referee or tournament director(s). Due to the time allowed for the completion of all games, the clock should run continuously.
 Tournament directors have the right to over-ride this rule and add time should they deem it necessary.

REFEREES

Referees will be USSF certified. All games will have 3 match officials.

PLAYER EQUIPMENT

- It will be the referees' discretion to determine the safety and suitability of player equipment.
- All players are required to wear shin guards.

FORFEITS

- The score of a forfeited game shall be recorded as 1-0 in favor of the team not forfeiting, if; 1) the game has not commenced, or 2) the game has commenced, and the non-forfeiting team has less than a 2-goal lead at the time of cessation.
- If the non-forfeiting team has a 2 goal, or more than a 2-goal lead, at the time of cessation the score shall stand as it is. Forfeiture will be declared for a failure to begin play within fifteen (15) minutes of game time. Failure to complete a match, a team leaving the field during play, fights / out of control players, and any circumstance (in the decision of the match official or tournament operators) that endangers the participants, spectators, or facilities may result in forfeiture.
- In no case will a team, which has forfeited a game, be declared a group winner or wild card.

DETERMINING WINNERS:

- Showcase Format Play 3 games and done.
- No advancements. No awards/medals.

Teams will be awarded points on the following basis:

- Three (3) points for each Win
- One (1) point for each Tie
- Zero (0) points for each Loss

In the event of a tie in points at the end of group play, the winner of a bracket and/or flight will be determined as follows:

- The winner in head-to-head competition. In the event of a 3-way tie, even after the elimination of 1 team through tie-breakers "B", "C", "D", and "E", the head-to-head tie breaker is NOT used. There is no reverting back to tiebreaker "A" in a 3-way tie.
- Goal differential, maximum of 3 per game (Team wins 5-0, scored as +3)
- Fewest goals against.
- Most total wins.
- Most shut outs.

MATCH & SCORE REPORTING

Match scores will be recorded by the match official following the game. A tournament representative or field marshall will collect the score from the match official, and have both coaches sign the score sheet. The score will then be radioed in to the tournament HQ for posting. It is the responsibility of the head coaches of each team in a match to

sign the scorecard directly following the game to verify the proper result.

The comprehensive list of score updates for all ages, flights, and brackets, for the entire tournament will be posted on-line via the tournament home page, www.paclassics.org.

EJECTIONS, CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

Any player or coach who is ejected from a game must serve a mandatory 1 game suspension for the next game that the team plays. Any player or coach who is found to participate in the next game when they should be serving a suspension will cause that game to be forfeited. Players can be ejected for accumulation of 2 yellow cards in the same match, or a straight red card. Coaches do not need to be shown a red card to be ejected. If an official tells a coach to leave the field, that is an ejection and will constitute a 1 game suspension for the coach. There will be no appeals of ejections/red cards unless a team feels there has been a case of mistaken identity for the player or coach ejected. In that situation a registered team representative needs to bring their concerns to the Tournament Director at the Showcase HQ for review.

A player, coach, team official, or spectator who is ejected for violent conduct, serious foul play, or racist remarks/actions may be subject to further sanctioning beyond a 1 game suspension. Any player, coach, team official, or spectator who assaults a referee will be expelled from the Tournament with further disciplinary action possible, up to and including contacting local authorities.

Tournament Directors reserve the right to levy additional discipline, up to and including expulsion of the entire team from the Tournament, at their discretion, should a situation warrant.

Pets, alcoholic beverages, aerial drones, firearms, and verbal or racial abuse are not permitted at any tournament venue. This applies to all participants and spectators. Failure to adhere to these rules can result in forfeiture of games or ejection from the premises.

PROTESTS & VIDEO FOOTAGE SUBMISSION

- Protests are not allowed, and none will be permitted.
- Video footage submitted to the tournament for the purpose of overturning results or re-officiating live game action will not be permitted.
- The Tournament Directors / Committee reserve the right to utilize video footage to determine disciplinary measure against players, coaches, or teams in the event of violent conduct/actions perpetrated by players, coaches, or spectators.

FINAL RULINGS

The final interpreter of the foregoing rules and regulations, and also any matters not provided for in these rules, will be the Tournament Directors, whose decisions shall be final.

WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, the Tournament Committee will have the authority to change games as follows:

- Relocate or reschedule any game(s)
- Change the duration of the game(s)
- Cancel any game(s), which have no bearing on the selection of the division winners.

HOTEL POLICY

Teams are required, as a condition of acceptance to the Winter College Showcase, to book all of their housing needs through Halpern Travel, the official travel service of the Winter College Showcase. Teams who do not utilize Halpern Travel to arrange accommodations are subject to penalty, up to an including, the revocation of acceptance to the Winter College Showcase without return of entry fees. Teams who are based 90 or more miles from Classics Soccer Park must use the hotel service. Teams who are based less than 90 miles away may commute to the event daily.
